#### **EVENSONG**

Please stand when the bells are rung. The Ministers enter as a hymn is sung.

- 1. At the name of Jesus every knee shall bow, every tongue confess him King of Glory now: this the Father's pleasure that we call him Lord, who from the beginning was the mighty Word.
- 2. Humbled for a season to receive a name from the lips of sinners unto whom he came, faithfully he bore it spotless to the last, brought it back victorious when from death he passed.
- 3. In your hearts enthrone him, there let him make new all that is not holy, all that is not true. He is God the Saviour, he is Christ the Lord, ever to be worshipped, trusted and adored.
- 4. When this same Lord Jesus shall appear again in his Father's glory, there with him to reign, then may we adore him, all before him bow, as our hearts confess him King of Glory now.

Remain seated for the FIRST LESSON from the Old Testament.

A reading from the Prophet Ezekiel.

[24:1-10, 25-31]

In the ninth year, in the tenth month, on the tenth day of the month, the word of the Lord came to me: Mortal, write down the name of this day, this very day. The king of Babylon has laid siege to Jerusalem this very day. And utter an allegory to the rebellious house and say to them, Thus says the Lord God: Set on the pot, set it on, pour in water also; put in it the pieces, all the good pieces, the thigh and the shoulder; fill it with choice bones.

Take the choicest one of the flock, pile the logs under it; boil its pieces, seethe also its bones in it.

Therefore, thus says the Lord God:
Woe to the bloody city,
the pot whose rust is in it,
whose rust has not gone out of it!
Empty it piece by piece,
making no choice at all.
For the blood she shed is inside it;
she placed it on a bare rock;
she did not pour it out on the ground,
to cover it with earth.

To rouse my wrath, to take vengeance, I have placed the blood she shed on a bare rock, so that it may not be covered.

Therefore thus says the Lord God:
Woe to the bloody city!
I will even make the pile great.
Heap up the logs, kindle the fire;
boil the meat well, mix in the spices,
let the bones be burned.

And you, mortal, on the day when I take from them their stronghold, their joy and glory, the delight of their eyes and their heart's affection, and also their sons and their daughters, on that day, one who has escaped will come to you to report to you the news. On that day your mouth shall be opened to the one who has

escaped, and you shall speak and no longer be silent. So you shall be a sign to them; and they shall know that I am the Lord.

#### A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews

[13.7-19]

Remember your leaders, those who spoke the word of God to you; consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever. Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teachings; for it is well for the heart to be strengthened by grace, not by regulations about food, which have not benefited those who observe them. We have an altar from which those who officiate in the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp.

Therefore Jesus also suffered outside the city gate in order to sanctify the people by his own blood. Let us then go to him outside the camp and bear the abuse he endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we are looking for the city that is to come. Through him, then, let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls and will give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with sighing—for that would be harmful to you.

Pray for us; we are sure that we have a clear conscience, desiring to act honourably in all things. I urge you all the more to do this, so that I may be restored to you very soon.
