THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah

[52.13-53:12]

See, my servant shall prosper; he shall be exalted and lifted up, and shall be very high. Just as there were many who were astonished at him —so marred was his appearance, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of mortals so he shall startle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which had not been told them they shall see, and that which they had not heard they shall contemplate. Who has believed what we have heard? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity; and as one from whom others hide their faces he was despised, and we held him of no account. Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken,

struck down by God, and afflicted.

But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed.

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

By a perversion of justice he was taken away.

Who could have imagined his future?

For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people.

They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain.
When you make his life an offering for sin,
he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days;
through him the will of the Lord shall prosper.
Out of his anguish he shall see light;
he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge.

Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong;

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE CROSS

Please stand as the hammer blows

A Cross is carried through the church. The bearer halts three times, at the entrance of the nave, in the midst of the congregation, and at the chancel step. At each place is repeated

Behold the wood of the cross, whereon was hung the Saviour of the world. **O come, let us worship.**

When the Cross is in place, the following acclamations are used

We adore thee, O Christ, and we bless thee Because by thy holy cross thou hast redeemed the world.

This is the wood of the cross, whereon was hung the Saviour of the world **O** come, let us worship.

O Saviour of the world, who by thy cross and precious blood hast redeemed us Save us and help us we humbly beseech thee O Lord.

One after another, all move up to the Cross and venerate it with a kiss, touch or bow.

The Reproaches are sung by the choir and congregation.

THE LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

The reserved sacrament is brought in silence from the Altar of Repose and placed on the main altar, which is covered only by a fair linen cloth. Two candles are lit. All stand.

Standing at the foot of the cross, let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Happy are those who are called to his supper. Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Communion is given in one kind only with the words

The body of Christ, broken for you

All baptised Christians who seek Christ in this sacrament are invited to receive Holy Communion. Anyone is welcome to receive a blessing instead. During communion the choir sing 'O come and mourn with me awhile' with harmonisation by Charles H. Giffen.
