Saskia is of Dutch and Italian heritage based in Melbourne/Naarm. They have recently completed The University of Melbourne's Master of Music (Opera Performance) directed by Jane Davidson, under the tutelage of Roxane Hislop.



They first discovered their love of music performance as a member of the children's chorus in Opera Australia's Turandot (2012), which led them to perform in every Victorian Opera Youth Production from 2014 to 2022. Over the last ten years, they have performed with the Young Voices of Melbourne, Victorian Opera Youth Choir Ensemble, the Victorian College of the Arts Secondary School, Opera Scholars Australia, the Melbourne Bach Choir, Victoria Chorale and the Australian Contemporary Opera Company. As an early music soloist, they have performed in Haydn's The Creation (2023), Durufle's Requiem (2023), Handel's Messiah (2024) and Charpentier's Messe di Minuit (2024). NERIDA EVANS - ORGAN SCHOLAR

Nerida began her musical journey as a child playing on dusty old pianos in church halls, loving the richness of their sound. During her adolescent and university years, she studied AMEB classical piano to Grade 8. After spending a decade abroad in the UK and Vietnam with her young family, she returned to classical piano — first through teaching and then performance.

While living in Vietnam, she discovered the powerful role music plays in bridging cultural divides, creating shared experiences within both local and expatriate communities. In 2020, Nerida joined the St John's Choir as an alto. Two years later, she was appointed Organ Scholar at Saint Agnes', Glen Huntly, and continues her music education with Yi-Shuen Chan. The Organ Scholarship provides Nerida with many performance and learning opportunities.

DIRECTOR OF MUSIC



ROWAN SWARBRICK - DIR. OF MUSIC

Rowan is a Melbourne-based baritone, conductor and double bassist. Under the tutelage of Andrew Sinclair, Rowan completed his Bachelor of Arts majoring in music performance (double bass) in 2019, at the University of Western Australia. He is currently studying his Masters of Orchestral music at the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music with Steve Reeves.

In voice studies, he has been a pupil of Andrew O'Connor and Carly Power, and first took conducting lessons with Kate McNamara. As a singer and conductor, Rowan worked extensively throughout the choirs of Perth, notably with the Giovanni consort from 2020 onwards, becoming their assistant director in 2022. Since relocating to Melbourne, Rowan has been employed as a freelance artist by groups and institutions such as Polyphonic Voices, the Australian National Academy of Music and Melbourne Opera, both as a singer and a bassist. Since being appointed as Director of Music at St. John's, East Malvern and St. Agnes', Glen Huntly, Rowan has begun increasing his compositional and pedagogical vocations, with plans to expand our music program here at Saint John's Finch Street.




