THE FIRST STATION: PALM SUNDAY

Jesus and his friends had arrived in Jerusalem to celebrate the festival of Passover. News had spread that Jesus was on the way and a huge crowd gathered. They put their coats on the floor and grabbed palm leaves to wave. What a surprise when Jesus arrived, he was riding on a young donkey! It was just as the Prophet Zechariah had written over 400 years before:

‘Rejoice greatly, people of Jerusalem! Shout for joy, people of Jerusalem! Your King is coming to you. He does what is right, and he saves. He is gentle and riding on a donkey, the colt of a donkey.

THE SECOND STATION: THE LAST SUPPER

Jesus and his friends had a special meal together. First, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, he wanted them to know that he came to be the servant of others. Jesus told his disciples that he was going to die, but told them not to be afraid. He then shared bread and wine with them, saying:

Take this bread and eat it; this is my body. Every one of you drink this. This is my blood which is the new agreement that God makes with his people. This blood is poured out for many to forgive their sins.

THE THIRD STATION: THE GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE

After their meal together, Jesus and his disciples went to the garden of Gethsemane. Jesus took time to pray, asking God to help him with the challenge he was about to face. While Jesus prayed, his disciples fell asleep. Jesus was disappointed that his friends could not stay awake with him while he prayed but the disciples did not really understand what was going to happen. Then Judas, who had betrayed Jesus, arrived with the soldiers and arrested him.

THE FOURTH STATION: JESUS' TRIAL

Jesus was brought before Pontius Pilate to be judged. Pilate asked Jesus if he was the “King of the Jews”. Jesus answered, “My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over”. Pilate knew that Jesus was innocent but the crowd called out “crucify him”. Pilate was afraid of the crowd so handed Jesus over to them. Later that same day, the soldiers put Jesus on the cross.

THE FIFTH STATION: JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS

When Jesus died the sky went dark, there was an earthquake, and the veil of the Temple – which divided people from God – was torn in two! Jesus died so that we might be forgiven; Even on the cross, Jesus forgave those who put him there. After he died, his friends took his body from the cross and laid him in a tomb. A large stone was placed in front of the entrance so no one could get in or out.
